### Genesis 1:27-29 (NLT)

Fill the earth and govern it. Reign over the fish in the sea, the birds in the sky, and all the animals that scurry along the ground." Then God said, "Look! I have given you every seed-bearing plant throughout the earth and all the fruit trees for your food. '

- QUESTION TO CONSIDER
- 1. What do you think God meant when he told us to govern and reign over the earth?
- 2. Why and how is it hard to "stand in for God" while doing your work? (Tim Keller quote: "We are called to stand in for God here in the world, exercising stewardship over the rest of creation in his place as his vice-regents. We share in doing things that God has done in creation bringing order out of chaos, creatively building a civilization out of the material of physical and human nature, caring for all that God has made." - 4. What do you find to be sacred about your job?



### Genesis 3:16-19 (NLT)

'Then he said to the woman, "I will sharpen the pain of your pregnancy, and in pain you will give birth. And you will desire to control your husband, but he will rule over you. " And to the man he said, "Since you listened to your wife and ate from the tree whose fruit I commanded you not to eat, the ground is cursed because of you. All your life you will struggle to scratch a living from it. It will grow thorns and thistles for you, though you will eat of its grains. By the sweat of your brow will you have food to eat until you return to the ground from which you were made. For you were made from dust, and to dust you will return."'



## QUESTION TO CONSIDER

- God wanted to provide abundantly for Adam and Eve all they had to do for food was pick the low-hanging fruit and enjoy! How did Adam and Eve's disobedience result in pain and make their life harder? How does our disobedience sometimes make our work-life harder?
- 2. What is your relationship with your work -- Is it more often: a) an idol, b) a necessary evil, or c) a sacred gift? Why and How?
- 3. Is there anything that consistently tries to move into first place in your life?
- 4. How much of your worth comes from your work?
- 5. How is your work a unique opportunity to be the hands and feet of God?
- 6. How can you shift your perspective on the most difficult part of your work so it becomes more sacred? How can you: 1) Set boundaries? 2) See work through the lens of gratitude? 3) Bless others and help the flourishing of humanity through your work?
